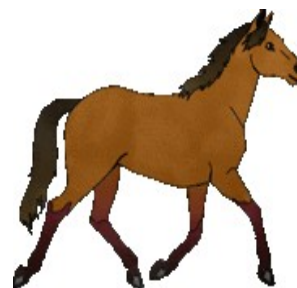

## Rules and Regulations

1. Subscriptions to the Society will be received at any time. Member tickets are \$5.00 and will admit one person to the grounds. The sum of \$4.00 will be retained from prize winnings as membership fees for the next year. There will be a \$0.25 per item entry fee in the Home Living Sections. Entry fee is to be paid when tickets are picked up.
2. Brood mares and cows must have borne young during the year. A mare must have a foal at foot or be heavy with foal, a cow must be giving milk at the time of exhibition or must be visibly in calf or a proven breeder.
3. All purebred animals over one year must be registered in the Canadian National Records. Those under one year must be eligible for registration. Pedigrees must be produced on application.
4. **ALL PRIZE CHEQUES TO BE CASHED WITHIN 180 DAYS.**
5. All stock exhibited to be the bonafide property of exhibitor for at least one month previous to exhibition.
6. No animal or article can compete in more than one section. Exception: (a) for special prizes; (b) individual horses may also enter as teams or herds. Herds shall consist of 1 male and 3 female.
7. No article will be admitted in which it does not have a distinguishing number obtained from the Section Secretary attached to it.
8. Domestic Manufacture and Ladies Work must have been made by the exhibitor and not have been shown at any former exhibition of this society. Factory made articles are not allowed to compete.
9. Articles entered for exhibition which are not in their assigned places by 9:30 am on the morning of the show will not be admitted to the competition.
10. Only one exhibit allowed by any exhibitor in classes other than Special Livestock entries. Note Special Livestock Rule #30.
11. In the absence of competition in any section, or if the stock, or articles exhibited are an inferior quality, the judges are instructed to award only such premiums as they think the articles are deserving of. They will exercise their discretion as to whether they award first, second, third, or any other prize.
12. a) No animal shall be removed from the show grounds until 5:00pm on the day of the show without leave of the President. If the prize animal is removed contrary to this rule, the premium award will be forfeited.  
b) No exhibit shall be removed from the exhibitor's hall until 4:00pm on the day of the show without leave of the President. If the prize article is removed contrary to this rule, the premium award will be forfeited.
13. Neither, the Society or any of its officials will be responsible for loss or injury to exhibits but care will be taken to prevent such loss or damage.
14. The Society will not be responsible for delivery to the prize winner of any article or amount which may be offered by any party as a Special Prize unless such article or amount is actually handed over to the Secretary.
15. Helper tickets will be provided to the stockmen: 1 ticket for every 4 entries, 3 tickets to be the limit. These must be obtained from the Secretary.
16. All prize animals to be paraded if required.

17. Protests against any awards shall be made to the Secretary in writing before the close of the exhibition, accompanied by a fee of \$1.00 which will be retained if the protest is not upheld.
18. Except livestock, separate exhibit required for Special Prizes.
19. No person will be allowed to interfere with the judges while in the discharge of their duties. Should an exhibitor so interfere, he or she will forfeit all claims to any premium to which they otherwise might be entitled.
20. All animals brought to the show to have secure means of fastening and be placed as directed.
21. The Director shall reserve the right to remove from the grounds any exhibit, animal, stand or show that may be falsely entered, or may be deemed unsuitable or objectionable without assigning a reason therefore, and if advisable return any money paid, for expire term for a space or stalls which stall exonerate them from any claim whatsoever on the part of the exhibitor or purchase.
22. If necessity arises through lack of funds, the Directors reserve the right to deduct a percentage from all Prize Money.
23. Canvassing on the grounds is prohibited on Fair Day, except on receiving permission from the Directors.
24. All trophies to be returned to the Secretary of the Society by 20 days before the Fair, and any person winning a trophy shall be responsible to the Society until it is returned.
25. All exhibitors of animals, machinery in motion and other exhibits liable to occasional accidents, injury or damage to persons coming in contact with them, shall guard their exhibits and protect the public from coming in contact therewith and every such exhibitor shall indemnify the exhibition from and against all claims and demands, costs, charges and expenses which or by reason of any such exhibit not being guarded properly, or the public not being properly protected therefrom.
26. No classes will be added or changed the day of the Fair.
27. Bedding will be supplied. Exhibitors to supply own hay/feed.
28. The Agricultural Society will accept no responsibility for accidents to an individual on the Fair Grounds.

### **Special Livestock Rules**

29. Only half the prize money will be paid if only one exhibitor in a class of cattle exhibits.
30. The Fair Board will allow an exhibitor to have 2 entries per class for a maximum of 2 classes – these extra entries designated by the exhibitor as to where they will be shown when making entries. Rule to apply to cattle only.
31. There must be separate entries for single and pairs in Steer Class. Exhibitor may show on of the pairs as a single.

## M.A.A.S. QUILT COMPETITION

M.A.A.S 2010 Quilt Competition - Sponsored by Triple E Recreational Vehicles

1. Competition is open to all quilt exhibitors who have not won first prize in the Agricultural Societies' Provincial Quilt Competition in the past three years.
2. The judging criteria used for judging is in the "Judging Standards" book.
3. Entry can be hand quilted or machine quilted. No commercial quilting will be allowed. Entry must be quilted by the person submitting the quilt.
4. Quilts must have an appropriate title.
5. Quilts must be at least 152cm x 178cm (60" x 70") to be considered for the competition.
6. Each society will select three quilts at their fair to participate in the district competition. Up to four quilts will then be chosen at the district competition to go on to the Provincial competition, two hand quilted and two machine quilted.
7. Exhibitors may enter more than one quilt in this competition, however, they may only have one quilt advance to the provincial finals.
8. Any quilt may be entered in competition at as many fairs as the exhibitor wishes, however, it may only represent the society where it was first entered in Provincial competition and won. The exhibitor must advise societies at the time of entry if the quilt is a winner at a previous fair.
9. If an exhibitor does not wish to participate in Provincial competition, the next runner-up quilt will be selected to represent the society in the district competition.
10. At the finals a \$1200.00 prize will be awarded in the hand quilting category and \$800.00 in the machine quilting category. At the end of the competition, the quilts will be returned to the quilters.
11. Pictures of the winning quilts and exhibitors are to be kept each year and placed in a traveling album.
12. At the district level, prize monies of \$20.00 will be awarded to the 2 top quilts in each category.
13. Pre-stamped and Cut Quilt kits are not allowed to enter, however "block of the month" quilts are eligible for competition.
14. Quilt is to be available for display at the M.A.A.S. conference until after the Saturday night banquet - approximately 10:30 p.m.
15. Quilt owners are responsible for insuring their own quilts. The sponsors, societies, and MAAS will not be liable for damage or loss.
16. A score sheet will be distributed to all societies which must be used to judge the quilts. Any quilt not scoring 70 or more points will not qualify for the district or final competition.


